

Performance Assessment Task

- ✓ Are there other things you would like to write about your dragon to help people find him? Add them to your poster.
- ✓ Be ready to share your poster. You will be asked to tell us about your picture and what you wrote. Describe your dragon, and explain why you want him back again.
- ✓ Now we can put up your poster, and hope someone finds your dragon!
